Every Sunday

Throughout the morning, **Fellowship** is offered in the Community Room and the Cathedral **Bookshop** is open on the first level. **Docent Tours** are available after the 10:30 service, to learn about the history and art of your cathedral. Meet at the pulpit.

Accessibility and Security

Spring and Summer Highlights

*The following are opportunities to gather with worship, music,
and joyful celebration in community this spring and summer.*

Newcomers Gathering, Sunday, May 12, Noon

If you are new to Saint Mark's, we invite you to a Newcomers Gathering, held in the Heritage Room after the 10:30am service. These gatherings enable you to become better acquainted with life of the Cathedral, and give you a chance to meet other newcomers and some Cathedral leaders.

Community Meal, Conversation and Compline, Wednesdays May 1, 8, 15; 6:00 – 7:30pm

A potluck meal will begin at 6pm. Please bring a food item to share with the community as you are able. After the meal, we will stay with our table groups to practice listening, as we hear from one another about hopes and desires for Saint Mark's. After discussions, the evening will close with Compline.

Ascension Day Eucharist, Thursday May 9, 7:30pm

We offer a Choral Eucharist for Ascension Day, as we celebrate Jesus' ascension into heaven 40 days after his resurrection. The Cathedral Choir will sing a mass setting by Harold Darke, as well as anthems appropriate for the day.

Music Series Season Finale, Saturday May 11, 7:30pm

Join us for the final concert of our season. Soprano Katie Boardman joins the Cathedral Choral Society, Cathedral Choir, and orchestra in performance of Francis Poulenc's *Gloria*. The program also features *Le Tombeau de Couperin* by Maurice Ravel, and the *Coronation Te Deum* by William Walton. Conducted by Raymond Johnston.

Doors Open Minneapolis, May 18 and 19, 10am – 5pm

Visit Saint Mark's the third weekend in May, to experience docent-led tours of the historic Nave, or simply to explore on your own. With scavenger hunts and music from our 5500-pipe Foley-Baker organ, you will also hear stories about this Cathedral that was completed in 1910.

Pentecost Picnic on the Lawn, May 19

Celebrate with us in Worship at 8am and 10:30am, then join in the fun with picnic foods that will be provided after both morning services. \$5 suggested offering, a portion of which will support youth pilgrimages.
