## Every Sunday

Throughout the morning, **Fellowship** is offered in the Community Room and the **Cathedral Bookshop** is open until 1pm on the first level. **Docent Tours** are available after the 10:30 service, to learn about the history and art of your cathedral. Meet at the pulpit.

During the 10:30 service, **Children's Worship** is available for children 8 and younger. Children leave with the Gradual Hymn and return at the exchange of the Peace. The **Nursery** is open from 9-12p for children 5 years and under. It is located next to the Library.

**Choral Evensong** is offered every Sunday at 5pm.

The First Lesson

## Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

Presider: The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Parents and Godparents: I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.*

Presider: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.*

Presider: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.*

Presider: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer: I renounce them.*

Presider: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer: I renounce them.*

Presider: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer: I renounce them.*

Presider: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer: I do.*

Presider: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer: I do.*

Presider: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Answer: I do.*

*After all have been presented, the Presider addresses the congregation,*

Presider: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their lives in Christ?

**People We will.**

Presider: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

*Please stand.*

## The Baptismal Covenant

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit  
and born of the Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
He descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again.  
He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

*The Presider concludes the Renewal of Vows as follows*

May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

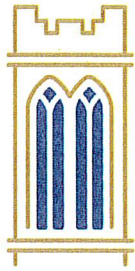
